

Solve Two Problems...



Wasted Talent: Of the 50 million people in the U.S. with a disability, less than 20% are participating in the labor force*

*Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2014



Solve Two Problems...



Wasted Resources: Globally only 17.4% of e-waste discarded in 2019 was recycled (United Nations)





Solve Two Problems...



In 2019, the U.S. generated 6.92 million tons of e-waste (46 lbs per person), only 15% of the material was recycled.

Recycle electronics to create jobs for people with disAbilities


Why are we doing this?
