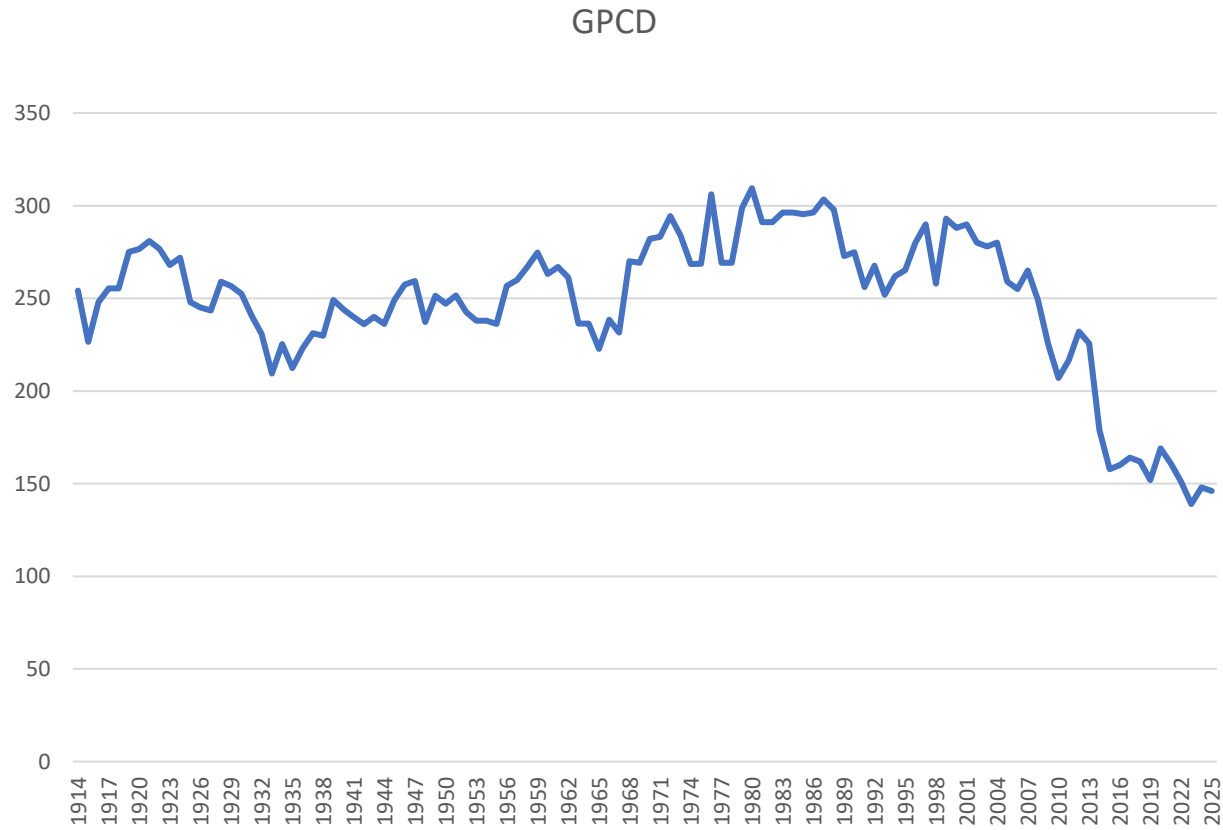

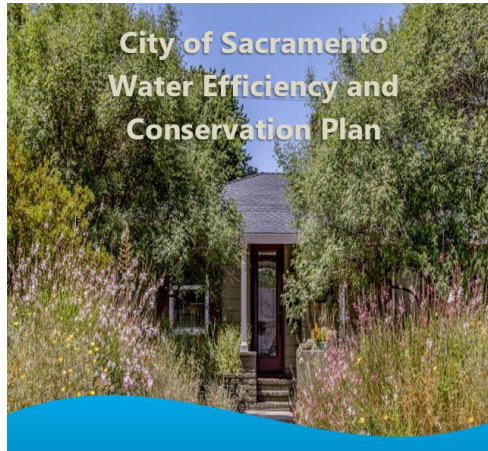

Time is running out for Sacramento residents to apply for a rebate on a high-efficiency washer.

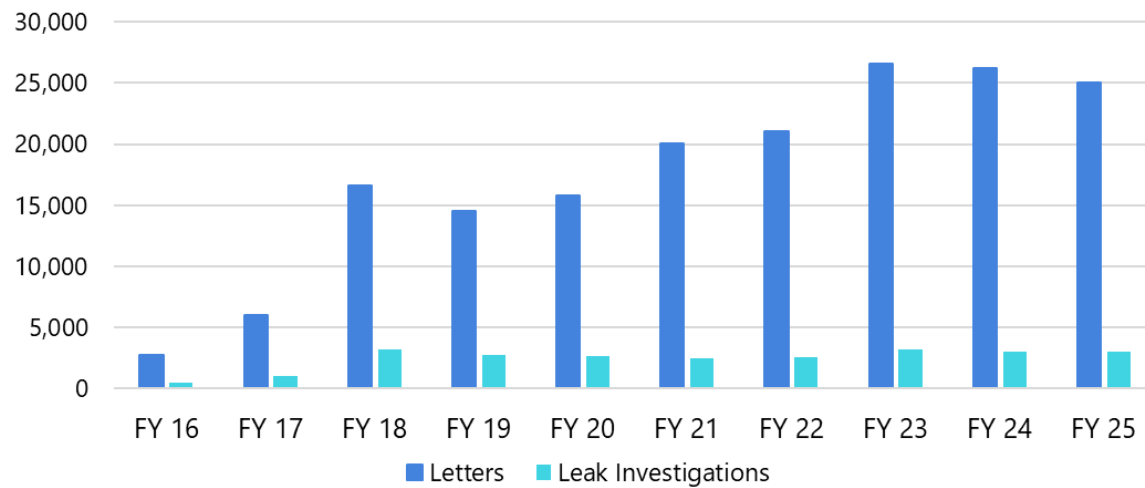
The City's [High-Efficiency Washer Rebate Program](#) will end on Dec. 15 after more than 15 years of helping residents reduce indoor water use.

Eligible customers can receive up to \$125 toward a new high-efficiency washer that uses up to 50% less water than older models.

To participate, please review the program requirements and submit your application and receipt by Dec. 15.

LEAK FREE SACRAMENTO

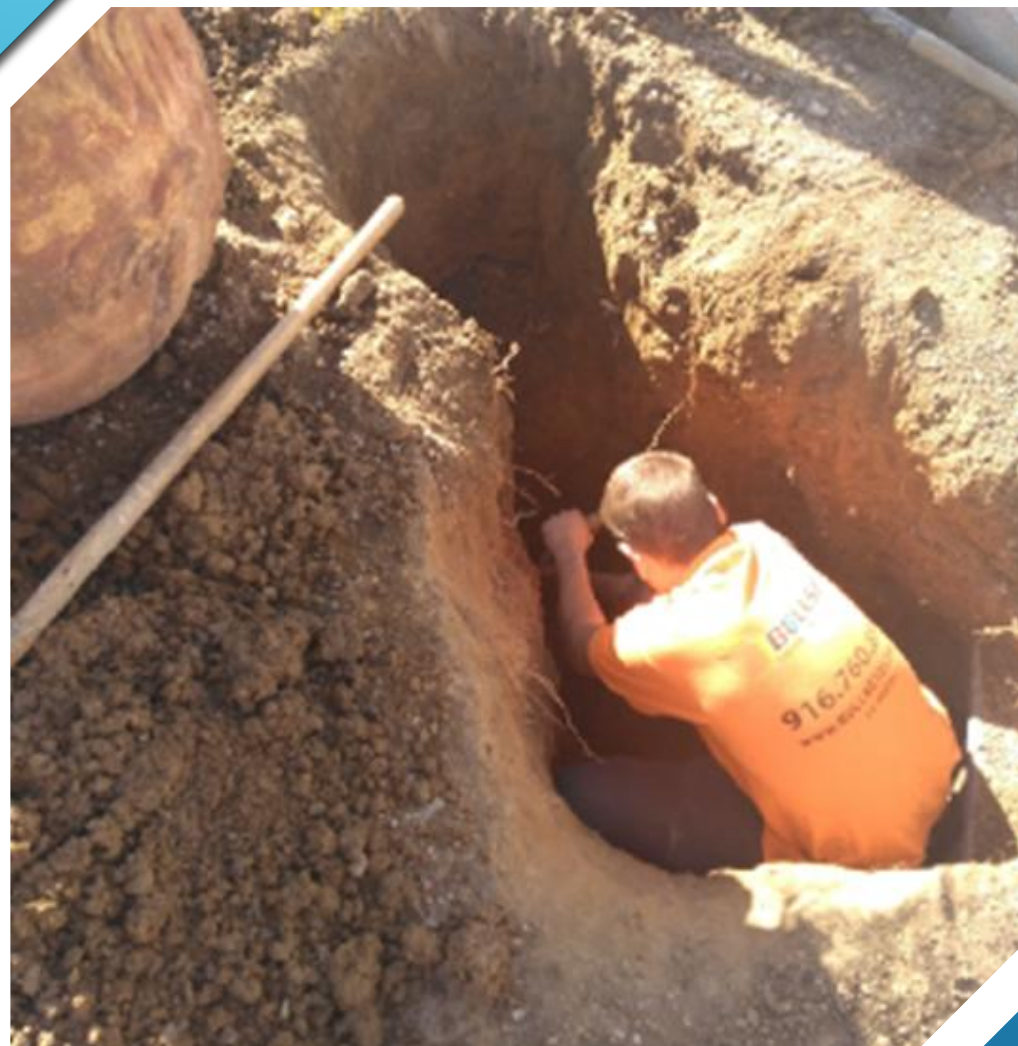
Eligibility: homeowners in our DAC or enrolled in the Sacramento Utility Rate Assistance Program

Funding sources: groundwater sales transfer and DWR grant funding = \$950,000

Typical cap on repair per customer –\$7,000

Fund 40-50 projects per year

- Min leak size: 25 GPH
- Average repair cost per residence: \$4,200
- Average leak size 140 GPH
- Average annual water savings per residence: 621,000 gallons



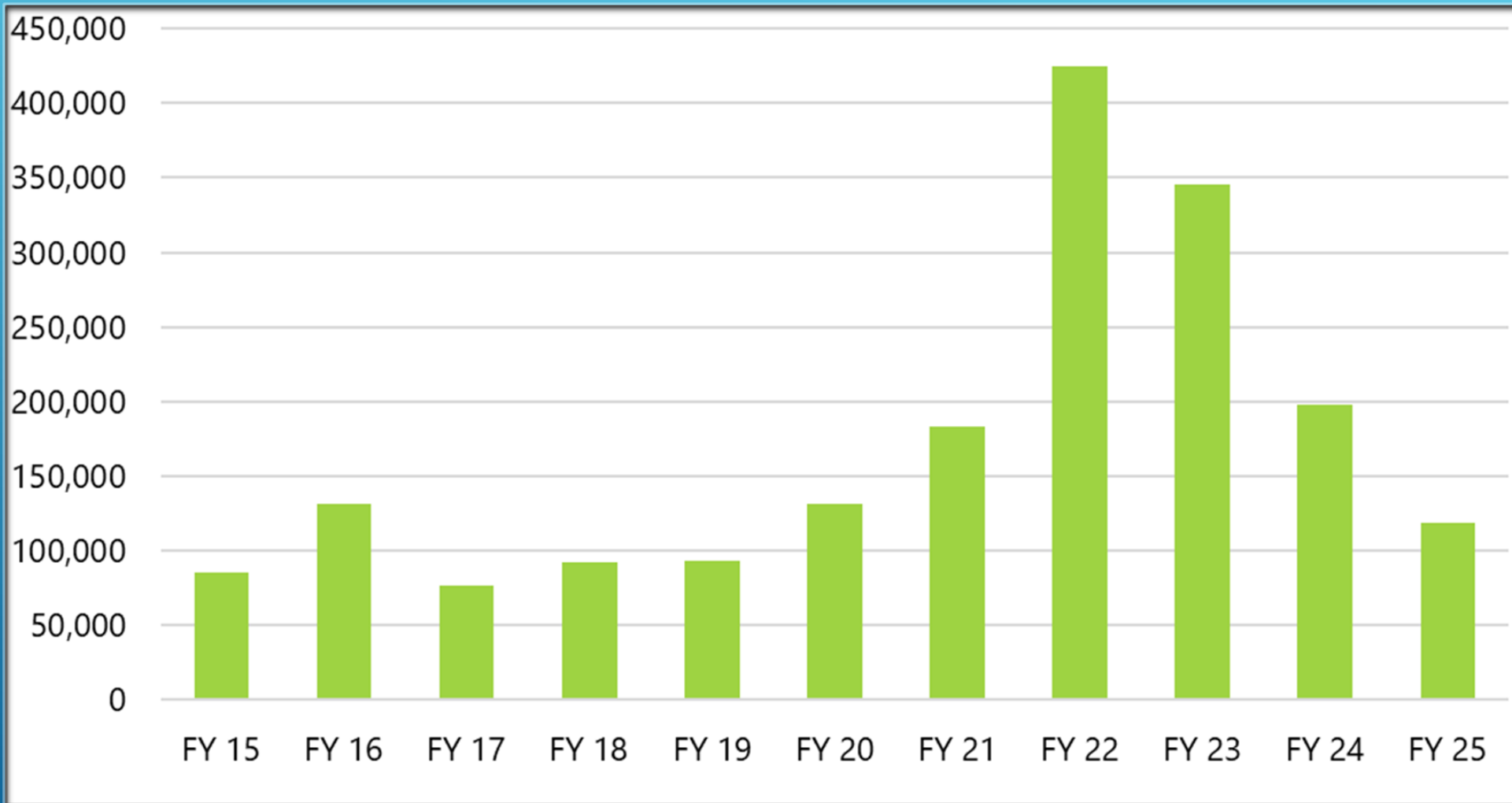
LEAK REPAIR ASSISTANCE (LRA) REBATE


Rebate is either \$250 or \$500- if
leak is 25 GPH or greater

Leak investigation required

\$40,000 budget this FY
